ANNOUNCEMENT

The Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory of Northwestern University School of Law has been purchased from the University by the Police Department of the City of Chicago. The property rights to all the equipment, apparatus, and supplies have been transferred to the Police Department, together with a lease of the present location of the Laboratory at 222 East Superior Street. In the future the Laboratory will be known as the Chicago Police Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory.

The Laboratory Staff, with the exception of Leonarde and Katherine Keeler, will remain the same, to be supplemented later with additional technicians. Fred E. Inbau of the present staff will act as Director.

Mr. Keeler will remain on the University faculty to carry on research in the detection of deception. Mrs. Keeler is entering private practice as a document examiner, with offices in the Continental Bank Building, 231 South La Salle Street, Chicago.

Publication of the American Journal of Police Science will continue as a section of the Journal of Criminal Law and Criminology, under the editorship of Mr. Inbau in collaboration with M. Edwin O'Neill, Charles M. Wilson, and Paul Trovillo of the Staff of the Chicago Police Scientific Crime Detection Laboratory.
