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Much of the material presented is of a rather technical character, with the result that the book will perhaps have its chief appeal among those already knowing something about the more scientific principles of graphology. But with the help of Sonnemann's lucid exposition, as well as with that of the numerous illustrations given, nearly any intelligent person who reads the book in a sober and unprejudiced frame of mind is certain to gain a clearer conception of the value which handwriting analysis may prove itself to have in the study and assessment of personality dynamics. Moreover, the psychologist or psychopathologist ought to find especially interesting the two chapters entitled *Graphic Expression of Psychopathology* and *Abnormal Samples*.
