In *Chemical Test Case Law* these matters are taken up point by point by Mr. Donigan, and presented in the light of the decided cases. His search was obviously painstaking and exhaustive. No important case in the field seems to have been omitted, and many other cases have been used for the purpose of analogy. A general grasp of the field of chemical tests for intoxication, a very careful analysis of the legal problems involved in this field, and a thorough search for the decided cases therein, have combined to make a useful contribution to law enforcement.

The lawyer will be astounded to find, in a book dealing with case law, an almost total lack of official citations. The author gives the volume and page at which each case will be found in the National Reporter System, but ignores almost entirely the official state reports. This, however, is a relatively minor matter. It is no doubt immaterial to the peace officer whether the citations are official or unofficial, and the lawyer can complete the citations with little effort.

This book is a "must" for prosecuting attorneys and for law enforcing units.
