should have negated any proof or contention that might have been submitted by the Crown. After examining civil and canon law, the court ruled otherwise, that "a King passing through another King's realm, or there resident is but a private person," so that Queen Elizabeth had the "right to punish the offence, the person, state and quality notwithstanding." Little did the court realize that by declaring that the transgressions of a monarch made even him subject to the executioner's axe, they would establish a legal precedent whose far-reaching significance would menace the future well-being of the royal hierarchy of western Europe.

With the tireless precision of a clinician, A. Francis Steuart has recorded the evidence. As a source book carefully drawing together the major documents relating to the trial of Mary Queen of Scots, the book has much to recommend it to the historical specialist and to the student of English law. But as a portraiture of Mary and a presentation of the color and pageantry, the brutality, the cruelty and the intrigue that made the Elizabethan days stand out in the pages of history, Mr. Steuart is less successful. He has recreated the known facts of the trial with considerable research, but he has approached them with cautious circumlocution and with restrained, slow-moving prose, all to the detriment of his book. One must also lament the editor's extensive quotations of contemporary sources within the body of the book, instead of segregating the documents in appendices where they would not distract the reader from the text of the account. Further, the lack of an index is hard to understand in a meticulously penned work abristle with names and detail.

BLOODY WILLIAMSON. By *Paul M. Angle*. Alfred A. Knopf, 1952. Pp. 300. \$4.00.

The author is well known as Director of the Chicago Historical Society since 1945. Prior to that time he had been Secretary of the Abraham Lincoln Association and Illinois State Historian (1932-1945). This small book is packed with historical details which represent an enormous amount of research spread over many years. It covers a black period in a certain section of the State of Illinois. There is no attempt here to "solve the problem."

The book is exciting enough to hold the reader and citizens should read it if for no other reason than to discover that such violence as was in Williamson County since the early 1870's almost to the present can "happen"—and that it may not yet be quite finished.
