Major General Thomas Ewing, first Chief Justice of the Supreme Court of Kansas, who volunteered to join the defense was not the former U.S. Senator. Nor was he a member of the cabinet in the Harrison and Tyler administration. The General's father, Judge Thomas Ewing ("The Salt Boiler") had been a member of the Senate from Ohio and Secretary of the Treasury in the Harrison and Tyler administration.

Under Zachary Taylor (1849 to 1850) he was Secretary of the Department of the Interior which had then just been organized. The author mentions the relationship of General Ewing to General William T. Sherman. It is correct that when Sherman was a very young child he became the adopted son of the elder Ewing. He took it upon himself to add to the relationship in his young manhood.
