to the reader the fundamentals of how to get along with people in the "role" to which each member of a group is assigned.

According to the author, the book was written "in the hope that the ideas and illustrations would be helpful to members who wished to train themselves and their fellow members in better methods for solving group problems." However, it remains to be seen whether people, such as the board-members of an agency, really believe that they have to be "trained" in order to solve problems, which they often feel are not inter-related to them. Prof. Klein appar-

ently took his cue for role-playing from Moreno and the latter's method of psychodrama, which Klein mistakenly thinks was the beginning of role-playing. (Of course, it started much earlier) Here, too, one will question the reference since Moreno's methods are supposed to be therapeutically oriented. All told, this reviewer feels that Association Press previously published volumes written by volunteers for volunteers, with less scholarship but also with less pretext.
